Vsebina:

Content (Syllabus outline):

Predmet izhaja iz področja mednarodnega javnega prava, pri čemer pa je zaradi celovitosti obravnavanja problematike globalnih migracij treba upoštevati tudi spoznanja s področja mednarodnih in diplomatskih odnosov ter globalnega upravljanja.

Predmet se prilagaja aktualnim problemom z navedenih področij in predvsem razvoju pravnih pravil in sodne prakse. Osrednja pozornost bo namenjena obravnavi določenih vprašanj znotraj posamičnih tem. Temeljna poglavja znotraj katerih se bodo obravnavala posamična vprašanja so razvidna iz osnovne strukture predmeta:

- Pojem, izvor in temelji globalnega prava migracij
- Globalni sistem transnacionalne mobilnosti ljudi
- Globalne varnostne, politične, družbene in ekonomske posledice migracij
- Globalne migracije in rasa, razred, spol, starost in drugi status
- Fragmentacija in neenakomerna porazdelitev migracijskih norm, pravil, dejavnosti in institucij na mednarodni, regionalni, naiconalni in subnacionalni ravni
- Migracije in mednarodno običajno pravo
- Migracije in mendarodno pogodbeno pravo (mednarodni pravni standardi za zaščito migrantov: begunci, delavci migranti, trgovanje in tihotapljenje migrantov)
- Možnosti globalnega prava migracij
- Mehko pravo in globalno upravljanje migracij (funkcije in razvoj mehkega prava, arhitektura globalnega upravljanja migracij)

The course derives from discipline of public international law, however due to the need to address the topic of global migration in a comprehensive manner, the findings from the disciplines such as international and diplomatic relations and global governance need to be considered as well.

The course is adjusted to address the topical problems from the above-mentioned disciplines, especially the development of legal norms and case law. The focus of the course will be particular issues within the discussed topics. The fundamental questions discussed will be within the scope of the following structure of the course:

- Notion, origins and foundations of global migration law
- Global system of transnational human mobility
- Global security, political, social and economic implications of migration
- Global migration and race, class, gender, age, and other status
- Fragmentation and uneven distribution of migration norms, rules, activities, and institutions at international, regional, national and subnational levels
- Migration and customary international law
- Migration and international treaty law (international legal standards for the protection of migrants: refugees, migrant workers, trafficked and smuggled migrants)
- Possibilities of global migration law
- Soft law and global migration governance (the functions and

Cilji in kompetence:

Objectives and competences:

Cilj predmeta je poglobljen študij izbranih poglavij s področja mednarodnega prava migracij in globalnega upravljanja migracij, vključno z aktualnimi izzivi pri delovanju mednarodnih organizacij in služb na tem področju. Posamezni primeri se obravnavajo interdisciplinarno.

Študentje bodo razvili **splošne kompetence**:

Pridobili bodo poglobljeno teoretično znanje nekaterih teoretično in praktično najzahtevnejših vprašanj mednarodnega prava, politik in globalnega upravljanja na področju transnacionalnih migracij. Zlasti bodo pridobili:

- sposobnost za raziskovanje teoretskih in praktičnih problemov prava in še posebej mednarodnega prava, mednarodnih odnosov in diplomacije,
- sposobnost samostojnega teoretičnega in praktičnega opazovanja ter analiziranja, primerjanja in sintetiziranja družbenih pojavov in procesov, vezanih na migracije ter na zgodovinsko-družbeni okvir njihovih konkretnih pojavnih oblik,
- sposobnost za samostojno, sistematično in reflektirano znanstvenoraziskovalno delo s skrbno pozornostjo do podrobnosti,
- sposobnost znanstvenega analiziranja problemov, vrednotenja različnih teoretičnih izhodišč, uporabe primerjalno pravne metode, kritičnega analiziranja prakse držav in mednarodne judikature ter pisnega oblikovanja zahtevnejše pravne argumentacije.

The objective of the course is a detailed study of the selected chapters and issues within the discipline of international migration law and global migration governance, including the topical challenges related to the functioning of international organizations and services in these areas. Individual issues will be discussed in an interdisciplinary manner. Students will develop the following

general competences:

They will acquire a thorough theoretical knowledge of some of the theoretically and practically most complicated issues of international law, policies and global governance regarding transnational migration. In particular, they will gain:

- the skills of researching theoretical and practical problems of law and in particular of international law, international relations and diplomacy,
- an ability to make independent theoretical and practical observations and to analyse, compare and synthesize social phenomena and processes related to migration and to the historical and social fabric of its manifestations,
- an ability to conduct an independent, systematic and reflective scientific research with scrupulous attention to detail,
- the skills of scientific analysis of problems, evaluation of different theoretical starting points, use of the comparative legal methods, critical analysis of state practice and international jurisprudence,

- pridobil sposobnost podrobne in skrbne znanstvene analize problemov z navedenih pravnih in sorodnih področij (mednarodni odnosi, diplomacija), vrednotenja različnih teoretičnih stališč, poglobljene analitične razlage odločitev sodišč in drugih nadzornih organov ter

- a necessary theoretical, methodological and analytical knowledge for understanding, contending with and handling topical issues in the field of global migration governance, as well as the EU law, policy and functioning in the field of migration, asylum and integrated border management,
- an excellent understanding of functioning of international organizations and other institutions and services that operate in the field of global migration,
- an ability of innovative thinking about transnational migrations and their interdisciplinary applicability.

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Reference nosilca / Lecture's references:

Gregor Maučec je docent za področje mednarodnega prava. Doktoriral je iz mednarodnega javnega prava na Pravni fakulteti Univerze v Mariboru. Svojo znanstveno-strokovno usposobljenost je nadgrajeval kot podoktorski raziskovalec na Pravni fakulteti Univerze v København (kot Marie Skłodowska-Curie Fellow), Evropskem univerzitetnem inštitutu v Firencah (kot Max Weber Fellow) in Pravni fakulteti Univerze v Kyotu (kot JSPS Postdoctoral Fellow). Njegovo raziskovanje in objave se ukvarjajo z mednarodno sodno funkcijo, zlasti s tem, kako jo razumejo in izvajajo sodniki raznih mednarodnih sodnih teles; z vedenjem in odločanjem mednarodnih sodnikov; z mednarodno sodno zaščito manjšin in avtohtonega prebivalstva; z mednarodnimi in internacionaliziranimi kazenskimi sodišči in tribunali; z diskriminacijo in poštenim sojenjem v kazenskem pravosodju, zlasti pri uporabi smrtne kazni; z vprašanji tranzicijske pravičnosti v pokonfliktnih družbah; ter s politikami in pravom EU na področju upravljanja meja, migracij in azila. Redno se udeležuje znanstvenih simpozijev in odmevnih konferenc, kakor tudi raznih pedagoških usposabljanj na področju visokošolskega izobraževanja. Izvedel je več gostujočih predavanj na tujih univerzah (Univerza v København, Univerza v Firencah in Univeritetni kolidž v Londonu). Od leta 2010 je tudi član uredniškega odbora Zbirke mednarodno pravo.

Gregor Maučec is an assistant professor of international law. He received his PhD in Public International Law from the University of Maribor Faculty of Law. Previously, he was a Marie Skłodowska-Curie Fellow at iCourts - the Centre of Excellence for International Courts at the University of Copenhagen Faculty of Law, Max Weber Postdoctoral Fellow in Law at the European University Institute and JSPS Postdoctoral Fellow at the School of Law, Kyoto University. His research and writing has focused on the international judicial function, and particularly how it is understood and carried out by the judges of different international adjudicative bodies; international judicial behavior and decision-making; protection of minorities and indigenous populations through international courts; international(ised) criminal courts and tribunals; discrimination, fair trial, criminal sentencing and the death penalty; various transitional justice issues in the post-conflict societies; and EU policies and law on the management of borders, migration and asylum. He regularly participates in scientific symposia and outstanding conferences, and attends various pedagogical trainings in the field of higher education. He has also guest lectured at the University of Copenhagen, University of Florence and University College London. Since 2010, he has been a member of the editorial board of Book collection on international law.
