Poglobiti in razširiti poznavanje in razumevanje diplomatskega in konzularnega prava ter povezanih in sorodnih tem. Predavanja so podana v treh vsebinskih sklopih. Prvič, diplomatsko in konzularno pravo. To je osrednji del predmeta, v katerem se predstavi, analizira in komentira pojem kot tak, v nadaljevanju pa se podrobno obravnava Dunajska konvencija o diplomatskih odnosih in

Content (Syllabus outline):

To present, elaborate and teach understanding of diplomatic and consular law as well as related topics. The course is structured in three parts. Firstly, diplomatic and consular law. This is the main and most thorough part of the course. We present, elaborate, discuss and comment diplomatic and consular law generally and along some most important aspects. A detailed

Dunajska konvencija o konzularnih odnosih ter opravi poglobljene primerjava obeh konvencij. Drugič, diplomatski protokol in diplomacija kot poklic. Predstavljena in komentirana so osnovna področja protokola (zlasti korespondenca in ceremonial), s praktičnimi primeri. Predstavljena je diplomacija kot poklic, vidiki, aktualni poudarki in odprta vprašanja.

Tretjič, zgodovina slovenske diplomacije. Podan je splošni pregled snovi in njena periodizacija, v nadaljevanju so obravnavana posamezna obdobja, tipični predstavniki in značilnosti obdobja. Zaključni poudarek je na diplomaciji slovenske države in nekaterih njenih izbranih značilnosti in trendih.

presentation and discussion of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations and the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, including numerous practical examples constitute the main part of the course as a whole. Secondly, diplomatic protocol and diplomacy as a profession. We present, comment and discuss various selected topics within the diplomatic protocol (primarily diplomatic correspondence and ceremonial), with numerous practical examples. We also discuss and comment diplomacy as a profession (vs. ad hoc diplomats, experts, bureaucrats etc.) and link them also with some aspects of the future development of diplomacy.

Thirdly, we present and discuss general outlines of the history of the Slovene diplomacy, main periods and some selected personalities, with a special emphasis on the diplomacy of the Slovene state.

Cilji in kompetence:

Objectives and competences:

To educate students to understand and comprehend diplomatic and consular law as well as related topics from the diplomatic protocol. To establish understanding of diplomacy as a profession, with its own specifics and characteristics. To present the understanding of the history of the Slovene diplomacy and its relation to the diplomacy of the Slovene state.

Predvideni študijski rezultati:

Znanje in razumevanje: poznavanje in razumevanje diplomatskega in konzularnega prava ter s tem povezanega protokola kot pravne osnove diplomacije. Razumeti pojmovanje diplomacije kot poklica in poznati diplomatsko zgodovino Slovencev in Slovenije.

Knowledge and understanding:
To understand and comprehend diplomatic and consular law, and related topics from the diplomatic protocol. To understand diplomacy as a profession with its own specifics and characteristics. To get acquainted with the history of the Slovene diplomacy and the diplomacy of the Slovene state.

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Reference nosilca / Lecturer's references:

Dr. Milan Jazbec je rojen leta 1956 v Brežicah. Doktoriral je na Univerzi v Celovcu leta 2000. Leta 1981 je diplomiral iz novinarstva in leta 1983 iz obramboslovja. Od leta 2015 je redni profesor diplomacije. Objavljenih ima več kot šestdeset knjig in je avtor več kot 140 člankov o diplomaciji in sorodnih temah v petnajstih jezikih.

Zaposlen je na Ministrstvu za zunanje zadeve Republike Slovenije, spada v prvo generacijo slovenskih diplomatov. Bil je šesti slovenski veleposlanik v Severni Makedoniji (2016–2020) in četrti v Turčiji (2010–2015), nerezidenčno akreditiran v Azerbajdžanu, Iraku, Iranu, Libanonu in Siriji. Bil je zadnji jugoslovanski konzul v Celovcu (1991) in prvi slovenski (1992–1995). Na Zunanjem ministrstvu je vodil konzularni sektor (1996), sektor za načrtovanje politik in raziskave (2006–2010) in sektor za evropske države (2015–2016).

V diplomatski službi je od jeseni 1987, vmes je bil državni sekretar na ministrstvu za obrambo (2000–2004). Poldrugo desetletje je aktiven v akademski sferi, habilitirani redni univerzitetni profesor diplomacije je od spomladi 2015 (izredni profesor 2009, docent 1994). Njegova biografija v sistemu COBISS obsega več kot 600 enot, bil je mentor sedmim doktorjem znanosti in 35 magistrrom. Ima večletno strateško izkušnjo iz mednarodnega gospodarstva z začetka kariere (Papirnica Krško, 1982–1987), ki jo pričel kot član predsedstva slovenske mladinske organizacije (1980–1981). Več kot desetletje se je aktivno ukvarjal z novinarstvom in delal za številne medije.

Od jeseni 2005 predava diplomacijo na Fakulteti za državne in evropske študije, Nova univerza. Je tudi višji predavatelj na Diplo Foundation, Ženeva. Bil je gostujoči predavatelj na univerzah Bilkent, METU in Ankara (Turčija) ter na South East European University, International Balkan University in University American College (S. Makedonija). Med drugim je tudi predaval na Dunajski diplomatski akademiji in na Columbia University, New York.

Zraven diplomacije kot dejavnosti, organizacije in poklica se pionirsko posveča še diplomaciji in literaturi ter razvija sociologijo diplomacije (monografija v slovenščini, razširjen prevod v angleščini in ruščini). Je član slovenskega društva za mednarodne odnose in slovenskega PEN ter ustanovni urednik mednarodne znanstvene revije European Perspectives (od 2009). Bil je član Upravnega odbora Inštituta za narodnostna vprašanja (2008–2011). Leta 2005 je prejel visoko avstrijsko državno odlikovanje veliki zlati častni znak z zvezdo za zasluge za Republiko Avstrijo.

Dr. Milan Jazbec was born in 1956 in Brežice. He gained his PhD at the University of Klagenfurt, Austria, in 2000. He graduated from journalism in 1981 as well as from defence studies in 1983. Since 2015 he is full professor of diplomacy. He published more than sixty books and is the author of more than 140 articles on diplomacy and related topics in fifteen languages.

He is employed at the Slovene Ministry of Foreign Affairs and is a member of the first generation

of Slovene diplomats. He was the sixth Slovene Ambassador to North Macedonia (2016–2020) and the fourth to Turkey (2010–2015), accredited also to Azerbaijan, Iran, Iraq, Lebanon and Syria. He was the last Yugoslav Consul in Klagenfurt (1991) as well as the first Slovene one (1992–1995). In the Foreign Ministry he was Director of the Consular Department (1996), the Policy Planning and Research Department (2006–2010), and the Department for European Countries (2015–2016).

He has been in the diplomatic service since autumn 1987 and was also State Secretary for Defence Policy in the Slovene Ministry of Defence (2000–2004). He was promoted to full professor of diplomacy in 2015 (to associated professor in 2009 and to assistant professor in 2004). In the Slovene academic register COBISS, he has more than 600 entries; he was mentor to seven PhD candidates and to 35 MA candidates. He has an extended experience from the strategic international management (Paper Mill Krško, 1982–1987) from the beginning of his career, which he started as a member of the Presidency of the Slovene Youth Organization (1980–1981). For decade and a half, he was also active as a journalist at different media.

Since autumn 2005 he is lecturing diplomacy at the Faculty of Government and European Studies at the Nova University and is also senior lecturer at Diplo Foundation, Geneva. He was visiting professor at Universities Bilkent, METU and Ankara in Turkey as well as at the South East European University, the International Balkan University and University American College in North Macedonia. He also gave lectures at the Vienna Diplomatic Academy and at Columbia University, New York.

His main research focus is diplomacy as activity, organization and profession, but also diplomacy and literature as well as sociology of diplomacy (publication in Slovene with extended translations in English and Russian). He is a member of the Slovene Association of International Relations and of the Slovene PEN and also the founding editor of the international scientific journal *European Perspectives* (since 2009). He was also member of the Supervisory Board of the Slovene Institute for Ethnic Studies (2008–2011). In 2005 he received a high Austrian decoration The Grand Golden Decoration with the Star for the Merit for the Republic of Austria.
