Predmet izhaja iz splošnega, osnovnega in preglednega poznavanja obravnavanega področja ter predstavlja ciljno nadgradnjo sledečih tem: nastanek, razvoj in definicije diplomacije, vrste diplomacije, diplomacija in globalizacija, diplomacija in digitalizacija, veliki multilateralni projekti v slovenski praksi, diplomatska organizacija in procesi v njej, diplomatsko in konzularno pravo, protokol in diplomacija kot poklic, varnost in zaščita

Content (Syllabus outline):

This course upgrades the previous general, basic and broader understanding of diplomacy (the origin, development and definition, special diplomacies, diplomacy and globalization, diplomacy and digitalization, outstanding Slovene multilateral projects, diplomatic organization and its processes, diplomatic and consular law, protocol and diplomacy as a profession, security and protection of diplomatic work, history of the Slovene diplomacy, future



delovanja, zgodovina slovenske diplomacije, prihodnost diplomacije. Konkreten izbor tem je odvisen od posameznih doktorskih kandidatov, njihovega predhodnega znanja in teme oz. ožjega področja disertacije. Ob tem se navezuje na spoznanja nekaterih sorodnih družboslovnih disciplin, ki se dotikajo diplomacije, npr. sociologija, politologija, komunikologija, organizacijske vede. Poudarek je na zgodovinskem in primerjalnem proučevanju odnosa država – diplomacija – družbeno-zgodovinska situacija kakor tudi na razumevanju diplomacije kot institucije mednarodne skupnosti. V tem smislu predmet uvede študente v sociologijo diplomacije. Poseben poudarek je na inovacijah v diplomatski praksi (npr. e-diplomacija, diplomacija in UI) in na stikanju diplomacije z nekaterimi drugimi področji, npr. diplomacija in literatura. Pri tem se pozornost študentov usmerja na razmišljanje o diplomacijah malih držav in njihovih specifičnostih po koncu hladne vojne.

of diplomacy) and deepens its selective and focused interdisciplinary understanding. The concrete selection of discussed topics depends on the previous knowledge of PhD candidates and on their thesis area/interests. It reaches out to some other fields like sociology, political sciences, communication and organization sciences. It focuses on historical and comparative research and understanding of the relations between state – diplomacy – social and historical situation as well as on understanding of diplomacy as an institution of the international society. At this point it introduces students to sociology of diplomacy. Furthermore, it brings into the research area also innovation in diplomatic practice (like e-diplomacy, diplomacy and AI) and to with diplomacy recently related fields like diplomacy and literature. It also particularly takes into account contemplation on diplomacies of new small states after the end of the Cold War.

Cilji in kompetence:

Razširiti in poglobiti splošno poznavanje diplomacije in diplomatskega prava ter obenem poznavanje področja usmeriti na izbrane teme ter poglobiti njihovo poznavanje. Omogočiti študentom vpogled v razvojno, primerjalno ter interdisciplinarno razumevanje obravnavane teme. Poudariti in poglobiti postmoderno razumevanje diplomacije in njeno soodvisnost od nevladnih in poslovnih akterjev. Zraven razumevanja nastanka in delovanja slovenske diplomacije usmeriti raziskovalno pozornost na EU kot diplomatskega akterja in na njeno diplomacijo. Razviti sposobnost samostojnega teoretičnega in praktičnega opazovanja ter analiziranja in sintetiziranja družbenih pojavov in procesov v okviru diplomacije.

Objectives and competences:

To broaden and enhance general and focused understanding of diplomacy and diplomatic law as well as to direct this understanding on selected current topics and to deepen their understanding. To enable students to cope with the development, comparison and interdisciplinary nature of diplomacy. To point out and deepen the postmodern understanding of diplomacy and its interdependence with nongovernmental and other actors. To get to know the emergence and establishment of the Slovene diplomacy and the circumstances of its appearance as well as that of the EU diplomacy (EEAS). To be able to research and promote these topics on an independent basis within the broader frame of analyzing and contemplating social processes that influence diplomacy.

Predvideni študijski rezultati:

Znanje in razumevanje:

Razumevanje obravnavanih tem ter njihova aplikacija na razumevanje in razlaganje tovrstnih pojavov in procesov v aktualni mednarodni skupnosti. Pri študentih razviti sposobnost samostojnega teoretičnega in praktičnega opazovanja ter analiziranja, primerjanja in sintetiziranja družbenih pojavov in procesov, vezanih na diplomacijo ter na zgodovinsko-družbeni okvir njenega konkretnega pojavljanja. Reference nosilca / Lecturer's references:

Dr. Milan Jazbec je rojen leta 1956 v Brežicah. Doktoriral je na Univerzi v Celovcu leta 2000. Leta 1981 je diplomiral iz novinarstva in leta 1983 iz obramboslovja. Od leta 2015 je redni profesor diplomacije. Objavljenih ima več kot sedemdeset knjig in je avtor več kot 150 člankov o diplomaciji in sorodnih temah v petnajstih jezikih.

Zaposlen je na Ministrstvu za zunanje in evropske zadeve Republike Slovenije, spada v prvo generacijo slovenskih diplomatov. Bil je šesti slovenski veleposlanik v Severni Makedoniji (2016–2020) in četrti v Turčiji (2010–2015), nerezidenčno akreditiran v Azerbajdžanu, Iraku, Iranu, Libanonu in Siriji. Bil je zadnji jugoslovanski konzul v Celovcu (1991) in prvi slovenski (1992–1995). Na Zunanjem ministrstvu je vodil konzularni sektor (1996), sektor za načrtovanje politik in raziskave (2006–2010) in sektor za evropske države (2015–2016).

V diplomatski službi je od jeseni 1987, vmes je bil državni sekretar na ministrstvu za obrambo (2000–2004). Poldrugo desetletje je aktiven v akademski sferi, habilitirani redni univerzitetni profesor diplomacije je od spomladi 2015. Njegova biografija v sistemu COBISS obsega več kot 650 enot, bil je mentor sedmim doktorjem znanosti in 35 magistrim. Ima večletno strateško izkušnjo iz mednarodnega gospodarstva z začetka kariere (Papirnica Krško, 1982–1987), ki jo



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prišel kot član predsedstva slovenske mladinske organizacije (1980-1981). Več kot desetletje se je aktivno ukvarjal z novinarstvom in delal za številne medije.

Od jeseni 2005 predava diplomacijo na Fakulteti za državne in evropske študije ter od ustanovitve dalje tudi na Fakulteti za slovenske in mednarodne študije, Nova univerza. Je tudi višji predavatelj na Diplo Foundation, Ženeva. Bil je gostujoči predavatelj na univerzah Bilkent, METU in Ankara (Turčija) ter na South East European University, International Balkan University in University American College (S. Makedonija). Med drugim je tudi predaval na Dunajski diplomatski akademiji in na Columbia University, New York.

Zraven diplomacije kot dejavnosti, organizacije in poklica se pionirsko posveča še diplomaciji in literaturi ter razvija sociologijo diplomacije (monografija v slovenščini, razširjen prevod v angleščini in ruščini). Je član slovenskega društva za mednarodne odnose in slovenskega PEN ter ustanovni urednik mednarodne znanstvene revije *European Perspectives* (od 2009). Bil je član Upravnega odbora Inštituta za narodnostna vprašanja (2008–2011). Leta 2005 je prejel visoko avstrijsko državno odlikovanje veliki zlati častni znak z zvezdo za zasluge za Republiko Avstrijo.

Dr. Milan Jazbec was born in 1956 in Brežice. He gained his PhD at the University of Klagenfurt, Austria, in 2000. He graduated from journalism in 1981 as well as from defense studies in 1983. Since 2015 he is full professor of diplomacy. He published more than seventy books and is the author of more than 150 articles on diplomacy and related topics in fifteen languages.

He is employed at the Slovene Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs and is a member of the first generation of Slovene diplomats. He was the sixth Slovene Ambassador to North Macedonia (2016–2020) and the fourth to Turkey (2010–2015), accredited also to Azerbaijan, Iran, Iraq, Lebanon and Syria. He was the last Yugoslav Consul in Klagenfurt (1991) as well as the first Slovene one (1992–1995). In the Foreign Ministry he was Director of the Consular Department (1996), the Policy Planning and Research Department (2006–2010), and the Department for European Countries (2015–2016).

He has been in the diplomatic service since autumn 1987 and was also State Secretary for Defense Policy in the Slovene Ministry of Defense (2000–2004). He was promoted to full professor of diplomacy in 2015. In the Slovene academic register COBISS, he has more than 650 entries; he was mentor to seven PhD candidates and to 35 MA candidates. He has an extended experience from the strategic international management (Paper Mill Krško, 1982–1987) from the beginning of his career, which he started as a member of the Presidency of the Slovene Youth Organization (1980-1981). For decade and a half, he was also active as a journalist at different media.

Since autumn 2005 he is lecturing diplomacy at the Faculty of Government and European Studies as well as the Faculty for Slovene and International studies, at the Nova University and is also senior fellow at Diplo Foundation, Geneva. He was visiting professor at Universities Bilkent, METU and Ankara in Turkey as well as at the South East European University, the International Balkan University and University American College in North Macedonia. He also gave lectures at the Vienna Diplomatic Academy and at Columbia University, New York.

His main research focus is diplomacy as activity, organization and profession, but also diplomacy and literature as well as sociology of diplomacy (publication in Slovene with extended translations in English and Russian). He is a member of the Slovene Association of International Relations and of the Slovene PEN and also the founding editor of the international scientific journal *European Perspectives* (since 2009). He was also member of the Supervisory Board of the Slovene Institute for Ethnic Studies (2008–2011). In 2005 he received a high Austrian decoration The Grand Golden Decoration with the Star for the Merit for the Republic of Austria.



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
